


Goal 4: Supporting parents and carers in their parental responsibilities and involvement in their children's learning at home and school.


PARENT INFORMATION EVENINGS Over the years St Thomas School and the P&F have run many parent information evenings. Are you interested in attending parent information sessions?










What are the areas that interest you?






What is your preferred day and time to attend these sessions (if interested)?




Do you feel as a community we are faith focused enough?




COMMUNICATION In regard to communication from your P&F committee, what is your preferred form of communication?




How much contact would you like?




